<u>Please Keep the Following in Mind:</u>

• While trained spiritual directors can offer a wide range of services, individual directors vary in what they choose to provide at any given time. Individual directors will be able to confirm whether they are currently able to offer monthly meetings for individual direction, leading retreats, teaching contemplative prayer, offering discernment tools, and/or consultation to provide congregational spiritual formation resources.

• For regular individual direction, spiritual directors are advised to only sit with individuals with whom they are not already in any kind of existing relationship. A good rule of thumb is to seek a spiritual director that is not currently playing any other role in your life.

• Rates for individual spiritual direction vary based on the experience and needs of the director, and can range from \$25-150/ session. Compensation for retreats, prayer workshops and consultation services will vary significantly, and should be agreed upon prior to beginning.
